



Investment objective


The primary objective of the Fund is capital appreciation in real terms over the investment horizon. The Fund is ideally suited to investors with a moderate to aggressive risk tolerance (measured in the base currency of the Fund) over an investment cycle of five years or longer. The diversified portfolio invests into a wide range of asset classes including cash, bonds, equities, property, commodities and alternative investment strategies. As this portfolio is global in nature, exposure will be taken in a wide range of currencies and markets.





Market commentary

In the US, it was refreshing to see a decrease in new daily corona cases since the start of August. However, 27 states still remain above the World Health Organization's (WHO) positive corona testing reopening limit of 5%. This high infection rate can be seen in the data, as the Google community mobility index and in-store credit card spending have moved sideways over the month.

On the political front, further stimulus packages have run out of steam as a further relief package continued struggling to get passed. This naturally has painful consequences for millions of Americans. Since the expiration of the \$600 per week stimulus package granted to workers who qualified for unemployment insurance, those who have lost their jobs find themselves back on normal, much less generous, unemployment benefits. All eyes remain on a vaccine or a further stimulus package, without this, the jobless are likely to struggle in the face of a potential prolonged period of inactivity due to the pandemic. The presidential campaign has continued to gather steam, with the most recent polls suggesting a Democrat victory.

Data releases for the month continued to point to solid, though moderating, growth in August. Flash purchasing managers' indices for both manufacturing and services have come in above analysts' expectations, with prints of 53.6 and 54.8 respectively. On the contrary, both the Empire State and Philly Fed Manufacturing surveys, fell short of expectations. Other bright spots in the US economy were housing starts, existing home sales, and homebuilder sentiment all beating expectations. The Fed announced that monetary policy will remain supportive for the foreseeable future in the form of average inflation targeting.

The S&P 500 ended the month up 7.2%.

In Europe, August news flow turned sour as it was dominated by increasing numbers of new corona virus cases in several countries, with numbers climbing back to levels last seen at the height of the crisis in March and April. Governments have implemented targeted measures such as travel limitations and the requirement to wear a face mask, opposed to new lockdowns. This has helped high frequency data, suggesting that the recent outbreak is yet to damage activity.

Data for Europe saw the seasonally adjusted unemployment rate increase slightly to 7.8% in June, up from 7.7% in May, suggesting that social safety nets present in most European countries continue to prevent major job losses. This resulted in consumer confidence remaining largely unchanged throughout August, with retail sales recovering to pre-crisis levels after monthly gains of 20.3% and 5.7% in May and June respectively. Increase in new car registrations in Europe, fuelled by government support schemes, suggest that the manufacturing rebound is ongoing.

Financial markets welcomed the European Council agreement in July to establish a EUR750 billion European Union (EU) recovery fund, which has helped reassure investors about the future of the EU. FSE DAX TR and Euronext Paris CAC 40 GR returned 5.13% and 3.42% respectively for the month while the MSCI Europe ex UK GR ended up 3.12% for the month.

In the UK, high frequency data such as travel and navigation app usage, show that activity has strengthened in August. New cases of corona virus have risen again in August but remain well below the WHO's limit for reopening. Quarter on quarter GDP declined by 20.4% over the second quarter. However, GDP data has already started to rebound in May and June, with monthly increases of 2.4% and 8.7% respectively, but overall output still remained almost 26% below its pre-crisis level.

FTSE 100 TR finished the month up 1.75%.

In China, manufacturing PMI for July came in at 52.8, indicating continued expansion. July economic data in general confirmed that the Chinese economy was continuing to recover, albeit at a slightly more moderate pace. While industrial production and fixed investment picked up by 4.8% and 8.3% YoY in July, retail sales came in weaker than expected with a contraction of 1.1%.

Emerging markets (MSCI Emerging Markets 50 NR) ended the month 4.15% higher.

The Caleo Global Flexible fund ended up 5.49% for the month.
